

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ALCOHOL/DRUGS

As students look forward to the many events during senior year (particularly the graduation events at the end of the year), please remember the school rules concerning the use of alcohol/drugs before, during, or after any school function remain in effect and will be enforced. BACCALAUREATE MASS

JSerra Catholic High School would like to cordially invite the Class of 2018 graduate and their family to join on the eve of Commencement for what has been traditionally known in Catholic schools as the "kick-off" event for graduates. The celebration of Mass will be held on campus inside the Pavilion at 5:30 p.m. on Friday, June 1, 2018 with a reception immediately following.



Baccalaureate Mass (cont.)

Baccalaureate Masses are a long-standing custom in Catholic schools whose purpose is to give thanks to God for the gifts, talents, and accomplishments of students as they end their high school careers, and to ask the Lord for His grace and blessing in the next season of their lives. Admission to Baccalaureate Mass is not ticketed and will be open to families, guests, and friends. For information regarding handicapped seating, please see (Tickets). If guests are unable to attend Baccalaureate Mass, there will be a live Internet feed.

On the day of Baccalaureate Mass, all seniors should report by 5:00 p.m. wearing their graduation gowns (no caps, tassels, or cords) and will enter in procession preceding the celebrant.

Attire for students: Graduation gowns are zipped up.

- Boys: Collared shirt, slacks, dress shoes and tie
- Girls: Dress, dress shoes (must follow JSerra guidelines for length and modesty)

CALIFORNIA SCHOLARSHIP FEDERATION (CSF)

CSF Life Members, also known as seal-bearers, have the gold seal of CSF affixed to their diplomas and are awarded gold stoles which are worn on graduation day. Life Membership is awarded to students who are members for at least four of their six semesters from sophomore through senior year with one semester being from their senior year.

Membership in CSF is neither automatic nor compulsory. It is the responsibility of the student to apply for membership before the announced deadline each semester (which is typically four weeks into the semester). Late applications are not accepted per CSF by-laws. Any student receiving a D or F in a subject is automatically disqualified per CSF by-laws.

There are three requirements for membership:

1. Application (found at www.jserra.org/csf, under “Files to Download”)
2. One-time dues of \$15.00 (paid online at www.jserra.org/csf, under “Pay Fee”)
3. Four hours of community service completed within each semester of membership

CATALINA TRIP

The Catalina Trip is scheduled for Tuesday, May 22, 2018. The Catalina Flyer will leave from Newport Beach for Avalon, promptly at 8:00 a.m. and will return at 5:45 p.m. Permission slips are required for each student to attend. The permission slip can be found in the Permission Slip section at the end of this book. Transportation to Newport and one Catalina activity must be indicated on the permission slip. Some activities require additional waivers and must be filled out and returned in order to participate.

This event is only open to JSerra seniors and takes place on Catalina Island. The student's Catalina Flyer ticket and one activity are included in the graduation fee.

Please bring money for lunch and any souvenirs as well as sunscreen and a sweatshirt. No "cheekie" bathing suits. All drink containers must be empty.

Students may find their own transportation to Balboa Pavilion, but are responsible for the cost of parking. Parking is limited so carpooling or being dropped off is encouraged. Parking is available in the Municipal Parking Lot which is located on Palm Street. To enter the parking lot, make a right turn into ocean front parking lot at the entrance located at the unused ticket booth. The daily rate is up to \$19.25 per day and payment is made at various self-serve pay stations found at the perimeter of the parking lot, or via smart phone. A license plate number and credit card or the correct amount of cash is required when paying at the pay stations. The pay stations do not provide change and do not give refunds.

Students also have the option of taking a bus to Balboa Pavilion and if they are using the school-provided bus, they must arrive at JSerra at 7:00 a.m. on the North Side of Campus near lunch tables.

Students who plan to attend the Catalina Trip must turn in a completed permission slip to Ms. Maggie DeLain by Tuesday, May 1, 2018.



CAP AND GOWN

The cost of the cap, gown, and tassel is covered in the graduation fee. Jostens will be visiting Theology classes in November and provide students with order forms for graduation memorabilia. Even though it is included in the graduation fee students must fill out the appropriate box on the order form from Jostens, clearly stating the height, weight, and graduates name so the cap and gown will be delivered accurately and on time.

Caps, gowns, and tassels are issued to seniors on Thursday, May 31, 2018 at graduation rehearsal. Males wear a crimson gown while females wear a white gown. These are issued only to those who have met all academic requirements, are in good standing with the Dean's Office and are cleared of any financial obligations with the Business Office. Caps, gowns and tassels become the property of the graduate and do not need to be returned.

CORDS AND STOLES

Cords and stoles are awarded to graduating seniors for academic accomplishments only-whether it is the successful completion of one of JSerra's esteemed Magnet Programs or membership in NHS or CSF.

Cords and stoles are issued to seniors on Thursday, May 31, 2018 at graduation rehearsal.

CHRISTIAN SERVICE HOURS

JSerra Catholic High School students are expected to serve their neighbors through acts of charity. JSerra's service program seeks to develop virtues of magnanimity, compassion, and generosity in each student through the practice of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, especially as it relates to the underprivileged and those in greatest need. The Christian Service Program is an essential part of the JSerra experience.



Christian Service Hours (cont.)

JSerra Christian Service is a requirement for graduation and a minimum of 80 hours must be completed over a student's 4-year career. All hours must be approved by the Christian Service Coordinator.

Deadlines:

- **January 15, 2018:** Service hours from the previous summer or first semester must be entered into x2VOL. Hours entered after January 15th will not be approved.
- **April 30, 2018:** Service hours from second semester must be entered into x2VOL. Hours entered after April 30th will not be approved.

Senior parents should attend Parent Night which will cover the entire college application process for their senior.

September-November: **College Admission Counselor Visits**

College Representatives meet with students on campus to answer questions regarding the College and provide more information.

2 Weeks prior to First College Application Due Date: **Green Means Go Form**

Location: College Counselor

Submit form to inform teachers what college recommendation letters will be sent

Fall 2017: **One on One College Counselor Meetings**

Time: Various

Location: College Counselor Office

Seniors will meet one-on-one with their counselor to discuss their plans after high school. Students will receive an email via Naviance to sign up for a time that works. The meetings typically last about one hour. Parents are encouraged to attend the last half-hour of this meeting.

Thursday, October 12, 2017: **College Fair**

Time: 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Location: Pavilion

Over 100+ college representatives will be on campus to provide information regarding the college. The first half hour will be open to seniors and only.

Spring 2018: **College Counselor Final Meeting**

Time: Spring 2018 (before May 1, 2018)

Location: College Counselor Office

Seniors will meet with their counselor to go over their college decision as well as any scholarships that were awarded. Students will need to bring their scholarship awards and acceptance letters to this meeting in order to document all of his/her accomplishments.

COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

Graduates are to arrive in their caps and gowns no later than 8:30 a.m. on the track for the Class of 2018 portrait. If a student arrives past 8:30 a.m., he/she will not be in the photograph.

Parking will be limited, so please carpool with family members if possible. The doors will open for guests to enter the Pavilion at 9:30 a.m. and at 9:00 a.m. for handicapped access. The ceremony will begin promptly at 10:00 a.m. Saving seats is not allowed due to their limited number. If guests are unable to attend the Commencement Ceremony, there will be a live Internet feed.

Attire for students: Graduation gowns (zipped up), caps and tassels, and cords. Leis may not be worn during the ceremony.

Boys: Collared Shirt, slacks, dress shoes and tie (no tennis shoes)

Girls: Dress and Dress Shoes (must follow JSerra guidelines for length and modesty)

Attire for Guests: Business Casual

DIPLOMAS

Diplomas are issued to all graduating seniors who have successfully met all academic, service, and financial requirements. Diplomas will be available for pickup the week after graduation in the front office of Building One.

FINAL EXAMS-SECOND SEMESTER

Seniors who receive a "B" or better in the 3rd and 4th quarters are exempt from finals in that class. The second semester final exam schedule for seniors is:

GRADUATION ANNOUNCEMENTS

Graduation announcements are often used by families to “announce” their student’s upcoming graduation. These items may be ordered directly from Jostens. Jack Nicholson, JSerra's Jostens representative, will distribute graduation announcement order forms during Theology classes in November. Orders will be collected during lunch in November and December. Families will receive 25 graduation announcements with name cards as part of their graduation fee. If an order form is not turned in by December 5, 2017, families may purchase through Jostens website and prices will increase. Orders may be placed online via the Jostens website.

GRADUATION FEE

Senior year is full of events designed to mark and celebrate the rite of passage when a student moves from being a high school senior to entering the new challenge of college.

The senior graduation fee of \$725.00 will be billed to the 2018 graduates families FACTS tuition account on Wednesday, November 1, 2017 and final payment is due by Friday, February 1, 2018. Remember the items listed below are not available on an a la carte basis.

Please keep in mind that the graduation fee must be paid before the graduate is eligible to receive his or her diploma.

Optional items (not included in the fee) are tickets to Homecoming, Winter Formal, and Prom, Senior Parking, and Senior Tribute Ads for the yearbook.

GRAD NIGHT

Grad Night is an all-night party, organized by the school to ensure a safe, drug and alcohol-free graduation celebration. Students will meet at JSerra on the North Side of campus near the lockers on Sunday, June 3, 2018 at 8:00 p.m. and return to the JSerra campus around 6:00 a.m. on Monday, June 4, 2018. The cost of Grad Night is included in the graduation fee. Students will not need to bring anything as everything will be provided and are not allowed to bring food, drinks, backpacks, bags, or purses.

Students should wear comfortable clothing, such as jeans, t-shirt, sweatshirt, and tennis shoes.

Students cars may not be parked overnight and graduates may not drive themselves home following this event.

Upon drop-off, parents will be given detailed information regarding the location of Grad Night.

Students who plan to attend Grad Night must turn in a completed permission slip to Ms. Maggie DeLain by Tuesday, May 1, 2018.



GRADUATION POLICY

In order to graduate from JSerra, a student must successfully complete a minimum of 270 credits of course work. Included within credits completed satisfactorily are the following course requirements:

A Christian Service component is required for graduation. See details on page 10 of the Parent Student Handbook.

*Students enrolled in the Medical Magnet Program are exempt from taking Health. In order to receive a diploma, a student must have earned a cumulative total GPA of 2.0 or better, have no “D”/ “F” or “Incomplete” grades on the transcript, and have no outstanding financial obligations. Additionally, students must have completed their Christian Service requirements (see Christian Service requirements on page 19 of the Parent Student Handbook).

Should a student have the misfortune of receiving a “D” or “F” grade in the senior year and the grade can be made up in summer school, the student may participate in graduation exercises, but will not receive a diploma until the “D” or “F” is remediated.

GRADUATION REHEARSAL

All seniors must attend a mandatory rehearsal starting at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, May 31, 2018 in the Pavilion. Rehearsal should last about 1 1/2 hours. Students may wear appropriate casual attire.

Students will receive their cap, gown, and cords. They will also receive the appropriate number of graduation tickets and parking passes (if requested) at the end of rehearsal.



KAIROS RETREATS

Kairos is a four-day experience encountering Christ within a Christian community, reserved for seniors at a critical juncture in their life. This retreat fills up fast, so plan ahead. The retreat is at the Oakbridge YoungLife Camp located in Ramona, CA. Students will need to pack a sleeping bag and personal items, and the rest is taken care of by the retreat leadership team.

Together, students and the retreat leadership team share two important life experiences: faith-building friendship and God's love. Prayer, small group discussions, Mass, confession, adoration, and fun are the focus of these days. While the format of the retreat is shaped around the Catholic Christian tradition, Kairos is open to students from all religious backgrounds. Kairos is aimed at inviting each student to reflect on his/her own personal journey of life and to respond to God's unique love for him/her. Some students are also invited to become retreat leaders after they attend a Kairos retreat. This is another great way to "give back" and to inspire others to live out their faith.

LIVE FOR OTHERS CAMINO

JSerra's annual Live for Others Camino is a Lion tradition with the purpose of helping graduating seniors reflect on the gifts that God has given them and what He has in store for them as they enter the next phase of their lives.

The Camino is named in honor of the late alumnus Tim Vorenkamp ('15), who passed away in 2016 from a rare cancer. Before his death, Tim founded the Live for Others Foundation, which raises awareness and funds the research to cure Synovial Cell Sarcoma.

The Live for Others Camino will take place on May 21, 2018, with Mass beginning at 6:15 a.m. in the JSerra Chapel and the walk beginning at 7:00 a.m. Students will receive a blessing from Father Damien and then start the 14-mile walk to St. Michael's Abbey.

Students will return to JSerra by bus around 12:30 p.m. Lunch will be provided at the Abbey, and snacks and water will be provided along the route.

Students who plan to attend Live for Others Camino must turn in a completed permission slip to Ms. Maggie DeLain by Tuesday, May 1, 2018.

LOCKER CLEAN OUT

Students must clean out their lockers on Tuesday, May 29, 2018 and Wednesday, May 30, 2018. Any and all materials (including locker shelves) left in the lockers will become property of JSerra on Thursday, May 31, 2018.

NATIONAL HONORS SOCIETY (NHS)

The NHS Chapter at JSerra Catholic High School serves to honor students who have demonstrated excellence in the areas of Scholarship, Leadership, Service, and Character. These characteristics have been associated with membership since the organization's inception.

It is important to understand that chapter membership not only recognizes students for their past accomplishments but also challenges them to develop further through active involvement in school activities and community service. In addition, students must remember that membership is an honor and a privilege and is not a right accorded to the academically eligible student.

NHS welcomes all junior and senior students with a CUMULATIVE weighted academic GPA of 4.0 or above. NHS members provide regular tutoring to their JSerra peers, and are distinguished by the official NHS white stole worn at graduation.

PROM

Prom will be on Thursday, May 24, 2018, and is open to juniors and seniors. Underclassmen may attend only at the invitation of an upperclassmen. Non-JSerra students are allowed to attend Prom if a guest pass contract is turned in to the Deans' Office the Wednesday preceding the dance. Seniors do NOT have school this day.

Prom is a formal dance. Please refer to page 43 of the Parent Student Handbook regarding dress code for formal dances. Students who are in violation of the Dress Code will not be permitted to enter the dance and their parents will be contacted. Students who alter their attire after entering the dance may be asked to leave. No refunds will be issued to students or guests who are denied entry or removed from any dance.

No students will be admitted after 9:00 p.m. unless prior arrangements have been made with the Deans. Early-out time for dances is 10:30 p.m.

ROSARIES

JSerra's founding is based on the teachings of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Regardless of families faith tradition, prayer should be an essential part of each person's daily life. Through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, one can accomplish things beyond the wildest imagination.

JSerra has a tradition that a rosary is given to each graduate at the Baccalaureate Mass. It takes about twelve minutes to recite a rosary, and graduates are encouraged to incorporate this into their prayer life.

SENIOR AWARD DESCRIPTIONS

JSerra Catholic High School is privileged to recognize the excellence of its students by presenting the most prestigious awards at the Senior Awards Ceremony, Baccalaureate Mass, and Commencement.

The Valedictorian Award is presented to the senior who throughout his or her high school career has demonstrated excellence in the most challenging academic courses offered by JSerra and is graduating with the highest academic GPA. For the purposes of this award, advanced placement classes will be considered more challenging than honors courses. To be eligible for this award, a student must have attended JSerra for at least three years and be in good standing with the school. The recipient of this award will deliver the commencement address at Commencement Ceremony. This award is presented at Commencement Ceremony.



Senior Award Descriptions (cont.)

The Salutatorian Award is presented to the senior who throughout his or her high school career has demonstrated excellence in the most challenging academic courses offered by JSerra and is graduating with the second highest academic GPA. For the purposes of this award, advanced placement classes will be considered more challenging than honors courses. To be eligible for this award, a student must have attended JSerra for at least three years and be in good standing with the school. The recipient of this award will address the graduating class at the Senior Awards Ceremony and will deliver the invocation at Commencement Ceremony. This award is presented at Baccalaureate Mass.

The JSerra Award is presented to the senior who has best exemplified JSerra's mission and philosophy. The recipient will be a well-rounded student who personifies the goals and values embodied in the school's mission statement. The Awards Nomination Committee will solicit input from faculty and then nominate proposed recipients of this award. The Awards Selection Committee will make the final selection. This award is presented at Commencement Ceremony.

The Msgr. Martin Award is presented to the senior who has most contributed to the well-being of others at JSerra throughout his or her high school career. The recipient will be distinguished in the furtherance of Catholic social justice and devotion to the Gospel message of love, service, and kindness. The recipient of this award will be selected by the Campus Ministry Department. This award is presented at Baccalaureate Mass.

The Senior Faculty Award is presented to the senior who is particularly admired and respected by the JSerra faculty for his or her contribution to school life. The Awards Nomination Committee will solicit input from faculty and then nominate proposed recipients of this award. The Awards Selection Committee will make the final selection. This award is presented at the Senior Mass and Awards Ceremony.

The Lion Award is presented to the senior who has engendered school spirit and contributed most to the extracurricular activities of JSerra. The Awards Nomination Committee will solicit input from the senior class and faculty and then nominate proposed recipients of this award. The Awards Selection Committee will make the final selection. This award is presented at Baccalaureate Mass.

The Leadership Award is presented to the senior who has engendered school spirit and demonstrated unsurpassed leadership to the JSerra community throughout his or her career at the school. The Awards Nomination Committee will solicit input from the senior class and faculty and then nominate proposed recipients of this award. The Awards Selection Committee will make the final selection. This award is presented at Baccalaureate Mass.



Senior Award Descriptions (cont.)

The Senior Scholar Athlete Awards are presented to the senior boy and girl who throughout their careers at JSerra have demonstrated excellence in both athletics and scholastic courses. To be eligible for this award, a student must have excelled in a JSerra varsity sport during their senior year and have at least a 4.0 scholastic GPA. The recipients of this award will be selected by the Athletic Director. This award is presented at the Senior Mass and Awards Ceremony.

The Christian Service Award is presented to the senior who has best demonstrated one or more of the corporal or spiritual works of mercy during his or her career at JSerra and is dedicated to serving an underprivileged, disenfranchised, or needy population. The recipient of this award will be selected by the Director of the Christian Service Department. This award is presented at the Senior Mass and Awards Ceremony.

The Athlete of the Year Awards are presented to the boy and girl who at JSerra have demonstrated excellence in their sport in that year. To be eligible for this award a student must have competed in a JSerra varsity sport and brought a level of excellence to their sport. The recipients of this award will be selected by the Athletic Director. This award is presented at the Senior Mass and Awards Ceremony.

The Departmental Gold Award is presented to seniors who have excelled in English, Theology, Mathematics, Social Studies, Fine Arts (performing/visual), World Languages and/or Science during his or her career at JSerra. The recipients of this award will be selected by the academic departments. This award is presented at the Senior Mass and Awards Ceremony.
