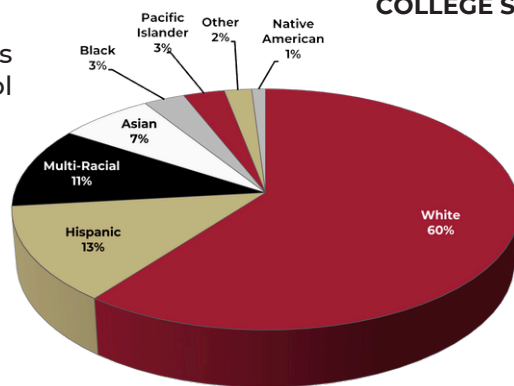

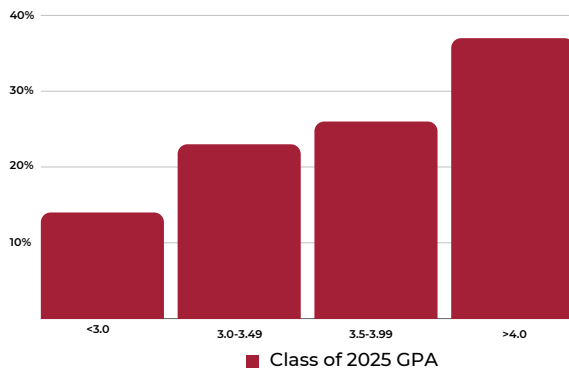
JSerra receives over 1,000 applications annually. Admission is determined by the High School Placement Test, prior school recommendations, and middle school grades.

- 48% female, 52% male
- 4% international students, 13 different countries
- 15:1 student/faculty
- 174 enrolled in a comprehensive support program
- 74 clubs: 15 social, 7 competitive, 10 extra-curricular, 42 service



GRADING

- JSerra follows a standard A-F grading scale, where an A corresponds to a 4.0.
- The school year includes two semesters comprised of approximately 18 weeks.
- JSerra does not rank students. Each student's curriculum is college preparatory and grading is rigorous.

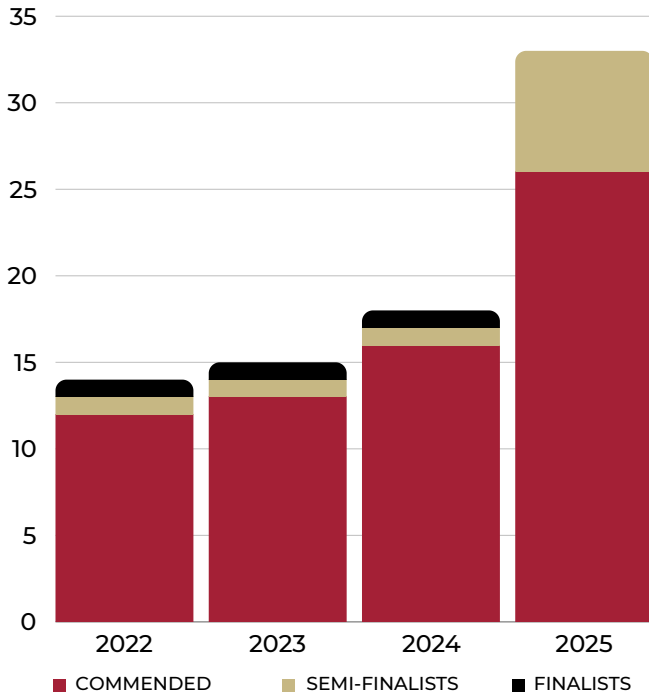

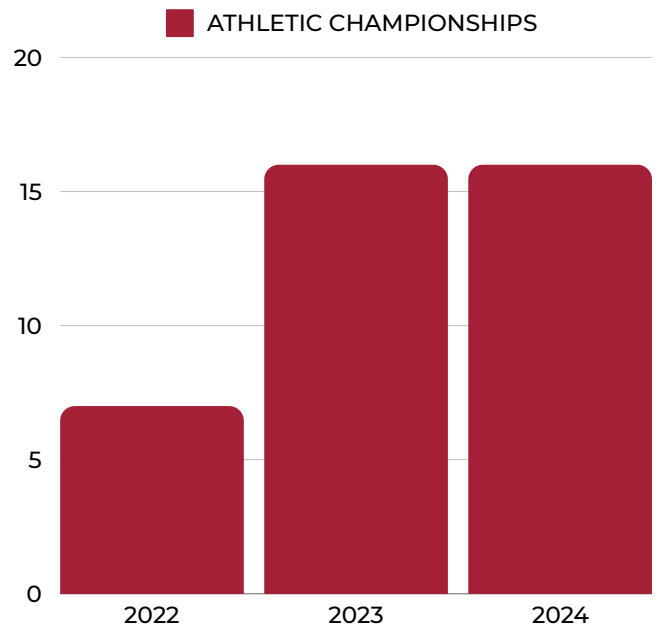

ENGINEERING MAGNET

The Tevora Engineering Magnet Program emphasizes hands-on laboratory experiments and project-based learning, preparing students for an engineering curriculum on the collegiate level.

This program adopts the curriculum of Project Lead the Way, a leader in providing rigorous and innovative STEM education.

BUSINESS MAGNET

The DuPont Business Magnet Program develops future leaders who are well-prepared, knowledgeable, and skilled for the global business environment, ready to excel at the nation's top business schools.

Students gain hands-on experience through their Senior Capstone Project which includes an off-campus internship and the creation of a comprehensive business plan they present to an executive panel.

Courses are articulated through Saddleback College, providing students with 18 units of college credit.

ARTS MAGNET

The Arts Magnet Program fosters students' skills to an advanced level in their principle art form. Students participate in Western Regional and Congressional competitions. The program offers a multitude of visual and performing arts courses.

MEDICAL MAGNET

The Medical Magnet Program requires four years of study that includes classroom instruction in advanced math and science combined with clinical knowledge provided by working professionals in a hospital setting.

This curriculum is rigorous and requires students to enroll in multiple science and math courses compared to the typical high school curriculum.

LAW MAGNET

The Patrick Ahle Law Magnet Program focuses on developing students' written, verbal, and analytical skills while introducing them to the field of law and preparing them for the rigors of law school. Our faculty have over 100 years of combined legal experience in both criminal and civil law.

This program gives students access to first-year law school curriculum and real-world experience in our state-of-the-art on-campus courtroom classroom.

- Legal Research & Writing

- Mock Trial Program

Courses are articulated through Saddleback College, providing students with 18 units of college credit and the opportunity to sit for the California Real Estate License exam.

HUMANITIES PROGRAM

The Humanities Program follows a four-year trajectory from the Ancients to Post-Modernism, studying the foundations, high points, and centrality of Christian culture and the Catholic worldview in forming an understanding of the human person. Focusing on readings in English and Theology from the Western canon and Christian culture, the program leads students to discover Christ revealed through the good, the true, and the beautiful.
